To 40 cms. Low clumps of green leaves. Summer flowering with cornflower-like flowers in a bright rose-pink-purple colour. Attracts bees/butterflies. Ideal in wildflower gardens.

To 40 cms. Grey green feathered foliage with large pink flowers from late spring. Sun. 1 to 1.5 litre.
- Coreopsis verticillata* D \$10.00  
To 40 cms. Bushy rhizomatous perennial with numerous branched stems. Bears yellow daisy like flowerheads in loose corymbs in early summer. Sun or part shade, well-drained soil. Large.
- Coreopsis verticillata* 'Moonbeam' D \$12.00  
50 cms. Deep green foliage, soft yellow daisy-like flowers summer/autumn. . Sun. Makes an ideal middle of border plant, cottage garden, rock garden, pots.
- Dianthus* 'Cranberry Ice' Few \$10.00  
To 35 cms. Fragrant single blooms spring to autumn. Fringed petals of bright cranberry red with a contrasting rose-pink eye. Great for rockery or edging. Attractive to butterflies. Sun. 1.5 litre.
- Dictamnus albus albiflorus* (Burning Bush) D \$11.00  
Rare. Year 2 plants – may take 2 years to flower. Mature plants grow to about 90 cms. Highly fragrant, white, 5-petalled flowers with long, projecting stamens are borne in long, open racemes in early summer. They and the unripe fruit, produce an aromatic, volatile oil which may be ignited in hot weather. Specimen plant best planted where you can brush past it so the beautiful fragrance is released. Suits a perennial border. Grow in dry, well drained, moderately fertile soil in full sun.
- Dictamnus albus* var. *purpureus* D \$10.00  
(Burning Bush). Year 2 plants. May take 2 years to flower. Mature plants are 80 to 90 cms. Highly fragrant, purply - mauve, 5-petalled flowers with darker veins and long, projecting stamens are borne in long, open racemes in early summer. Specimen plant in garden and best planted where you can brush past them so you can enjoy the fragrance released.
- Dimorphotheca barbarae compacta* \$10.00  
(African Daisy). Height to 30 cms. Compact, large flowering variety with pink flowers. Very long flowering ground cover. Sun. Large pots.

 To 1 metre. Huge, deep red, satiny flowers late spring/early summer. Sun.

Papaver orientale 'Princess Victoria Louise' D \$12.00

Penstemon 'Stapleford Gem' \$12.00  
 Seldom available and a stunning, popular variety. To 60 cms. Flowers from mid-summer with beautiful lilac-purple flowers which have pale lilac-pink upper lips and white lower lips and throats marked with purple lines. Sun/part shade

Phlomis 'Bronze Flamingo' D \$12.00  
 Rare. Abundant lavender pink hooded flowers on dark burgundy stems from late spring to summer. Specimen plant. Sun and well drained soil with medium moisture. Tolerates some drought. Attractive to bees and butterflies.

Phlox paniculata 'Le Madhi' Cut back D \$12.00  
 To 90 cms. Large heads of purple flowers in summer. Fragrant. Sun or light shade.

Phlox paniculata 'Vintage Wine' Cut back D \$12.00  
 To 1 metre. Clumps of dark green leaves with deep burgundy edges and colouring. Large heads of bright cerise-purple scented flowers in summer. Sun to light shade.

Phlox paniculata Mixed Cut back D \$12.00

Phyteuma scheuchzeri D \$12.00  
 Low mound of narrow blue-green leaves. Taller stems hold spiky ball-shaped clusters of deep blue flowers in summer. Rich moist soil and good drainage. Excellent rock garden or edging plant.

Potentilla verna \$10.00  
 15 cms. Small light yellow, cup-shaped flowers in spring. Sun. Suits rockery or edge of border.

Salvias are long flowering, showy, highly fragrant plants for sunny borders.  
 Good drainage. Attract bees.

Salvias Red 4 for \$36.00  
 Colours may be brighter red to purply red. Taller highly fragrant. Attracts bees, Long flowering. Sun.

Salvia 'Glare' \$12.00  
 To 70 cms. Masses of bright white flowers. Long flowering. Compact habit. Good drainage. Sun.

To 80 cms. Fragrant leaves and showy flowers that are a very good salmon colour. Flowers late spring onwards. Long flowering. Sun and good drainage. Attracts bees and butterflies. Popular.

To 80 cms. Stunning deep 2 tone purple flowers. Highly fragrant. Sun or partial shade - dead heading encourages more flowers. Good drainage. Popular.

- Sanguisorba officinalis D \$12.00  
(Greater burnet). 60 to 90 cms. Popular hardy perennial, forming clumps of pinnate leaves. Long-lasting, deep red bottle-brush like flowers in summer. Sun. Sanguisorbas are very popular in recent years.
- Sanguisorba tenuifolia 'Rubra' D \$12.00  
To 80. Drooping arching stems of slender bottlebrush like flowers in summer, that are a lovely rosy red colour. Sun. Clump forming habit. Very popular.

Alpine. To 24 cms when in flower. Dense mat of grey green rosettes with silvery edging. Panicles of small starry flowers with long yellowish-white petals. Rockery. Sun or light shade.

To 60 cms. Masses of large blue flowers on tall stalks. Remove old flowers to prolong flowering spring to autumn. Sun, good drainage.
- Scabiosa caucasica 'Mt Cook' \$12.00  
To 50 cms. Large white flowers which are suitable for cutting. Sun or light shade.
- Scabiosa caucasica 'Perfecta alba' Few \$12.00  
To 80 cms. Frilly white flowers. Attracts butterflies/bees. Great cut flower. Sun or light shade.

(Painted Daisy). To 90 cms. Pretty pink, single daisy flowers late spring/summer. Finely-cut, ferny like foliage. Sun/semi-shade. Cottage garden, mixed border, cut flowers last well. Popular.
- Tanacetum coccineum 'Robinson's Red' D \$12.00  
(Painted Daisy). To 90 cms. Pretty deepest reddish/pink flowers late spring/summer. Ferny like foliage. Sun/semi-shade. Mixed borders. Cut flowers last well. Popular.
- Veronica spicata 'Alba' Few D \$12.00  
To 50 cms. Low mounds of soft green leaves with toothed edges. Small white flowers on upright spikes in summer. Sun. Clump forming.

To 60 cms when in flower in summer. Long spikes of purple flowers. Sun.

### **Perennials - Shade**

Aconitum anthora D \$15.00  
To 80 cms in flower. Erect stems with pale yellow hooded blossoms. Deeply dissected foliage. Gritty, well-drained soil. Lime loving.

Aconitum napellus Collect or Trimmed D \$12.00  
To 1.5 metres. Hooded purply blue flowers late summer/autumn. Part/full shade. Moist.

Aconitum 'Newry Blue' Trimmed D \$10.00  
To 1.2 metres. Hooded purply blue flowers on very erect spikes early to mid-summer. Unusually early for Aconitum. Great for back of border – best staked. Part shade, moist. 1.5 litre.

Aconitum 'Newry Blue' - sent barerooted 5 pieces - \$20.00

Aconitum ssp. vulgare 'Albidum' D \$15.00  
To 1.5 metres Upright, tuberous, deciduous perennial with rounded, dark green leaves divided into five to seven, slender, toothed lobes and dense racemes of hooded, white flowers in summer. Suits sun or part shade. Impressive.

Anemone multifida 'Rubra' D \$12.00  
30 cms. Single, deep rose, carmine red, long stemmed flowers with a pale yellow centre. Green ferny-like leaves. Attractive fluffy seedheads. Sun and good drainage. Suits rock garden, mixed border or edge of woodland. Drought tolerant. Attracts butterflies.

Anemone nemerosa 'Bracteata Pleniflora' Few D 10.00  
Woodland Anemone to 10 cms. Deep green foliage. Double white flowers with a green ruff in spring. Great for borders, rock gardens, tubs and in masses around the base of trees. Prefers semi shade.

Anemone nemerosa lavender blue D \$10.00  
To 10 cms. Pretty lavender blue flowers in spring. Deep green foliage. Ground cover for border, rock gardens, tubs and around trees. Rich well-drained soil. Semi-shade.

Anemone nemerosa pale lavender blue D \$10.00  
Later flowering variety.

Anemone nemerosa mixed D \$10.00  
May include blue shades, lemon or yellow.

Anemone ranunculoides sulphurea 'Flore Plena' D \$10.00

*Arisarum proboscideum* (Mouse Plant) D \$8.00  
Deep green, glossy, arrowhead leaves. Long-tailed, brown and white flowers that suggest mice doing handstands in the greenery. Ground cover. Goes dormant in hot weather. Partial shade. 5 pieces \$20

*Aruncus dioicus* Trimmed D \$12.00  
(Goats Beard). To 1.5 metres. Many dramatic plumes composed of tiny, white flowers in autumn. Light shade and moist soil-needs moisture over summer. Ideal for light shade and by water.

*Astilbe chinensis* D \$10.00  
To 40 cms in flower. Deep purplish pink flowers late summer/autumn. Moist soil, shade.

*Astilbe simplicifolia* 'Sprite' D \$12.00  
Dwarf variety. Foliage to 45 cms tall. Glossy, dark bronze-green leaves. Shell-pink flowers to 30 cms tall in early summer. Moist soil.

*Bergenia* 'Wanaka Wine' Few \$20.00  
To 40 cms. Attractive, large, heart-shaped leaves that are glossy green, turning wine/burgundy in winter. Stalks of pink flowers early spring. Great ground cover for light shade. Drought tolerant.

*Centaurea dealbata* D \$12.00  
Height to about 60 cms. Dark pink flowers over divided foliage. Sun or part shade - tolerates drier conditions. Attracts bees and butterflies.

*Chiastophyllum oppositifolium* \$12.00  
Alpine succulent. To 15 cms. Unusual dangling yellow flowers with fleshy leaves which change colour from mid-green to red. Containers, rockeries and rock wall. Dappled shade. Good drainage.

*Cimicifuga americana* Collect or Trimmed D \$15.00  
To 1.2 metres. Spikes of fragrant white flowers summer/autumn. Excellent for cutting.

*Cimicifuga racemosa* Collect or Trimmed D \$15.00  
To 1.2 metres. Popular. Tall wands of creamy white bottle-brush flowers are held high above bright green, lacy foliage from mid-summer to late autumn. Splendid for cutting! Moist soil and some shade. Will tolerate full sun in cool summer regions.

*Corydalis lutea* Few \$10.00  
Height 30 to 40 cms. Ground cover. Mounds of green ferny foliage. Beautiful golden yellow flowers for months. Very useful to use at the base of woody trees and shrubs. Part shade and good drainage.

*Dicentra cucullaria* - Pink D \$12.00  
Green fern-like foliage in spring. Pink flowers. Woodland ground cover.

*Disporopsis omeiensis* \$12.00  
Resembles an evergreen Solomon's Seal with snakeskin patterns on the stem, pale greenish-yellow flowers. To 50 cms. Some shade best.

*Disporopsis pernyi* D \$15.00  
To 45 cms. Upright-arching, purple-spotted stems with shiny, leather leaves. Evergreen. Pendulous, tubular, creamy-white, bell-shaped flowers from late spring. Purple-blue berries ripen in early autumn. Rhizomatous, clump forming ground cover. Moist, well-drained soil for part shade.

*Disporum sessile* 'Variegatum' D \$10.00  
To 25 cms. Green and white striped variegated leaves. 25mm hanging creamy white bells. Forms a showy colony in shade. An excellent groundcover under shrubs.

*Dracunculus vulgaris* May be summer dormant D \$10.00  
Corms are 4-6 cms in width. (Dragon Lily). Large purple spathe and spadix. Unpleasant smell when in flower. The large palmate leaves have cream flecks along the veins. Sun or shade. Can also withstand drought but benefits from a little watering. Humus-rich, well-drained soil.

*Epimedium* Mixed \$12.00  
Great foliage plants for dry, shady areas such as under trees. Colours may include creamy lemon, yellow, white or pink.

*Geranium macrorrhizum*  
(Cranesbill). (Big Root Geranium). To 45 cms. Aromatic spicy foliage that is rounded, lobed and divided. Small pink flowers in spring. Great ground cover for shady edging. 5 pieces \$20.00

*Heuchera maxima* Few \$12.00  
To 70 cms in flower. Great for dry shade. Large, rounded leaves with slightly scalloped edges. Spikes of creamy white flowers above foliage spring to summer. Ground cover, suits under trees.

*Heuchera sanguinea alba* \$12.00  
To 45 cms. Long spikes of creamy-white flowers summer to autumn. Clump forming with nice green/white foliage. Sun or part shade.

*Hosta abiqua* 'Drinking Gourd' D \$15.00  
To 45 cms. Dark blue-green, seersucker leaves with heavy substance. White flowers early summer. Part to full shade and moist soil. 1 litre.

*Hosta* 'Blue Angel' D \$15.00  
To 90 cms. Heavily textured blue leaves. Light to full shade. Great for borders, ground cover, waterside or woodland gardens. Nice specimen plant. Large.

*Hosta* 'Empress Wu' D \$15.00  
To 1.2 metre. Largest variety available. Impressive with huge, thick, dark green leaves. Reddish violet flowers in summer. Moist shade. 1.5 litre.

*Hosta* 'Fire Island' D \$15.00  
Brilliant yellow leaves accented by bright red petioles in spring. Leaves become gently rippled with some corrugation at maturity. Best with morning sun and dappled shade later in the day. Lavender flowers in summer. Low growing.

*Hosta* 'Kiwiskyscraper' D \$15.00  
To 1 metre. Rich blue-green, thick foliage in a distinctly upright large mound. Great background or specimen plant. Moist, rich soil and part to full shade. 2 litre pots.

*Hosta* 'Purple Heart' D \$15.00  
To 40 cms. Leaves have thick substance and are clear lime to mid green. Dark purple red stems with the colour extending into the base of the leaves. Slight veining. Violet flowers.

Hosta 'Sieboldiana Glauca' D \$15.00  
To 90 cms. Lovely blue-green heavily ribbed leaves. Droopy mauve bell-shaped flowers late summer. Shade, moist humus rich soil. 1.5 to 2 litre pots

Kirengeshoma palmata May need trimmed Few D \$20.00  
(Yellow Wax Bells). Rare – seldom available. .6 to 1.2 metres. Reddish-purple stems. Sharply lobed leaves. 3 cms long flowers with 5 creamy-yellow petals which overlap. Humus rich soil, part shade. Woodland garden

Peltiphyllum peltata Trimmed D \$12.00  
(Darmara peltata) .90 to 1.3 metres. Rounded cymes of numerous 5-petalled pink flowers to 1.5 cms across in late spring followed by very large impressive, rounded leaves. Rounded, deeply lobed, coarsely toothed, dark green leaves with conspicuous veins to 60 cms across, that turn red in autumn. Slowly spreading, rhizomatous perennial that suits part or full shade.

Persicaria microcephala 'Red Dragon' Trimmed D 5 pieces - \$20.00  
To 90 cms. Beautiful foliage. Pointy heart-shaped leaves are medium green with a silvery V-shaped marking and a bronze centre. Tiny white flowers late summer. Part/full shade.

Primula marginata \$12.00  
Early flowering alpine. Irregular leaf edges- silvery margins. Purple flowers. Very good drainage.

Primula sieboldii are about 20 cms in height and summer dormant. Leaves are pale green, wrinkled and covered in short hairs. Pretty flowers, often fringed, in spring. Part shade. Light woodland.

Suits by water, woodland, or in other moist garden sites. Humous rich soil, partial shade to full sun.

Rodgersia podophylla Collect or trimmed D \$15.00  
1 metre. Great architectural plant for moist, humus rich soil and some shade. Striking bronze coloured leaves in spring, going dark green through summer, then turning red in autumn. Masses of tiny creamy white flowers, sometimes flushed pink or red.

Rumex sanguineus \$12.00  
30 cms. Pointed, bright lime-green leaves with dark red veins. Harvest young leaves for salads. Sun/light shade and moist soil

Saxifraga crustata \$10.00  
Alpine. To 24 cms when in flower. Dense mat of grey green rosettes with silvery edging. Panicles of small starry flowers with long yellowish-white petals. Rockery. Sun or light shade.

Semiaquilegia ecalcarta D \$12.00  
To 40 cms. Finely divided ferny-like leaves. Upright stems with graceful nodding flowers in shades of deep violet to wine purple from late spring to summer. bright woodland areas, edging, or rock garden.



Teucrium scorodonia Crispum Marginatum D \$13.00  
(Woodland sage). 35 cms. Mounding ground cover with unusual, ruffled leaves with a touch of white on the edges. Nice texture. Spikes of tiny charming lipped, cream to pale yellow-green flowers in summer. Shade. Tolerates dry conditions once established.

Thalictrum aquilegifolium 'Alba Trimmed D \$10.00  
To 1m. Stems of pretty foliage topped with fluffy whitish flowers from late spring. Sun, semi-shade.

Thalictrum dipterocarpum/delavayi Trimmed Few D \$12.00  
To 1.5 metre. Purple tinted stems and ferny like foliage. Clusters of large, fluffy-looking flowers with lilac petals and pale, yellow stamens. Summer flowering. Sun or part shade. Suits cottage, woodland or meadow

Thalictrum flavum Trimmed D \$10.00  
(Yellow Meadow Rue). Large cloud-like sprays of tiny lemon/yellow flowers which are outstanding for cutting. Best staked. Useful background plant. 1.5 litre pots.

Tricyrtis formosana variegata D \$10.00  
(Toad Lily). Unique and easy, hardy perennial for shady areas. Leafy, arching stems produce a fall display of bizarre star-shaped flowers in autumn, excellent for cutting. Soft lavender-pink flowers, heavily spotted in rose-purple. Variegated leaves. Coded as Number six.

Veratrum nigrum D \$15.00  
Mature plants grow to about 1.2 metres. Superb variety and perhaps the finest of all Veratrum. Strong spikes bear dark purple, almost black, star-shaped flowers. Leathery green leaves are beautifully pleated. Long lived border plant. Part sun/part shade.
