Bulbs

Camassia Bulbs D 3 small sized bulbs - \$10
(NB – the last pots of camassias have some broken stems so not looking quite so good after strong wind. Potted up in 5 to 7 cm square pots. Mature bulbs have flowering spikes to about 1 metre. Tall straight stems and racemes of star-shaped blue flowers – mixed blues. Racemes of flowers open from bottom to top. Late spring to early summer flowering. Impressive and hard to source.

Eucomis – white with pink tinge medium/large bulbs D \$6.00
Height to 45 cms+. Sun and good drainage. Autumn flowering. Potted.

Eucomis – white with pink tinge – 3 medium sized bulbs 3 for \$10.00

Muscari ‘Iceberg’ 3 for \$9.00
Have flowered. Lovely pale blue flowers in spring. Sun and good drainage.

Muscari ‘Peppermint’ 3 large sized bulbs \$10.00
Lightest of blue with a pretty white top. Sun and good drainage.

Muscari ‘Touch of Snow’ 5 medium/large sized bulbs - \$10.00
Rich cobalt blue flowers with a 'touch of snow' on 10 to 15 cm stems in spring. Plant in groups. Sun.

Anemonopsis macrophylla 10 for \$5.00
Mixed - could be either the white/amethyst/violet variety or white. Mature plants have foliage to at least 55 cms. Divided ferny foliage. Choice woodland plant. Slender, elegant spikes bear nodding, opalescent flowers. Humus-rich, semi-shaded, moist but well drained soil.

Cimicifuga americana 20 for \$5.00
To 1.2 metres. Spikes of fragrant white flowers summer/autumn. Excellent for cutting.

Clanthus puniceus (Kakabeak) 30 for \$4.00
Native shrub with striking clusters of red flowers. To 2 metres. Flowers spring to early summer. 2024.

Incarvillea delavayi 20 for \$4.00
To 35 cms. Masses of large pink, trumpet shaped flowers from late spring.

Incarvillea delavayi 20 for \$4.00
To 35 cms. Masses of large, pure white trumpet shaped flowers from late spring. Cut back after flowering so this will rebloom. Bold, divided leaves. Sun. Moist, well-drained soil. Nice for pots.

Lathyrus latifolius ‘White Pearl’ 30 for \$4.00
Large white flowers in summer. Climber. Sun. 2024 seed.

To 35 cms. Red flowers with white corolla. Sun and good drainage. Very pretty.		
Aquilegia Chrysantha 'Denver Gold'	D	\$10.00
To 90 cms. Long-spurred yellow flowers in spring. Sun or light shade.

To 60 cms. Long spurred red flowers in summer. Sun and good drainage		
Aquilegia flabellata Cameo - White	D	\$10.00
To 20 cms. Pretty white flowers, some with bluish tinge in spring. Attracts bees, butterflies and moths. Sun or part shade. Suits rock garden or front of border.		
Aquilegia Moorcroftiana	D	\$10.00
A taller and very beautiful variety with the palest lavender/pink flowers. Sun or light shade.		
Argyranthemum 'Harvest Gold'		\$12.00
To 40 cms. Masses of light-yellow daisy-like flowers and very long flowering. A trim back promotes more flowering. Sun.		
Astrantia major Green/White	D	\$12.00
To 80 cms in height. The inflorescence is umbrella-shaped, with 2–3 centimetres of diameter. The small flowers are green and white - a touch of pink is seen at a certain time of the flower development but this changes to green and white. Sun or part shade. Clump forming. Popular.		
Astrantia major Mixed	D	\$10.00
Colours unknown but could be pale pink/white/green. Sun and good drainage.		
Campanula 'Fleur de Neige'	D	\$12.00
To 90 cms. Long spikes of double white flowers in summer. Sun to part shade.

To 90 cms. Large, single white bells. Clump forming. Sun or light shade.		
Campanula punctata 'Milky Way'	D	\$12.00
To 50 cms. Nodding, bell-shaped flowers on red stems. Clump forming foliage. Large, light pink flowers have a double skirt and spotted throat. Light shade, moist well-drained soil.		
Campanula rotundifolia	D	\$12.00
(Bluebells of Scotland). Height to 25 cms. Graceful, nodding, mauve-purple bells in early summer. Ideal for edging, containers and rock gardens. Sun. Long flowering.		
Campanula 'Van Houttei' (Mystic Bells)	D	\$12.00
60 cms. Pretty, clump forming ground cover for sunny area. Constant abundance of large mid blue flowers from late spring to autumn. Trim after flowering for repeat flowerings. Large pots.		
Centaurea Jacea	Few	\$10.00
To 40 cms. Low clumps of green leaves. Summer flowering with cornflower-like flowers in a bright rose-pink-purple colour. Attracts bees/butterflies. Ideal in wildflower gardens.		
Centaurea pulcherrima	D	\$10.00
To 40 cms. Grey green feathered foliage with large pink flowers from late spring. Sun. 1 to 1.5 litre.

To 40 cms. Bushy rhizomatous perennial with numerous branched stems. Bears yellow daisy like flowerheads in loose corymbs in early summer. Sun or part shade, well-drained soil. Large.
- Coreopsis verticillata* ‘Moonbeam’ D 5 pieces for \$20.00
50 cms. Deep green foliage, soft yellow daisy-like flowers summer/autumn. Sun. Makes an ideal middle of border plant, cottage garden, rock garden, pots.
- Dianthus* ‘Knappii’ Few \$12.00
To 40 cms. Drought tolerant alpine. Long stems with clusters of light-yellow flowers in summer. Average/dry/sandy well-drained soil. Attracts insects.
- Dictamnus albus* var. *purpureus* D \$10.00
(Burning Bush). Year 2 plants. May take 2 years to flower. Mature plants are 80 to 90 cms. Highly fragrant, purple - mauve, 5-petalled flowers with darker veins and long, projecting stamens are borne in long, open racemes in early summer. Specimen plant in garden and best planted where you can brush past them so you can enjoy the fragrance released.
- Dimorphotheca barbarae* compacta \$10.00
(African Daisy). Height to 30 cms. Compact, large flowering variety with pink flowers. Very long flowering ground cover. Sun. Large pots.
- Erysimum* ‘Orange ‘Flame’ Few 10.00
Low growing, clump forming, ground cover for a sunny spot, rockery or over edging. Pretty orangy coloured flowers – long flowering.
- Geranium armenum* ‘Red Propellors’ D \$20.00
To 40 cms. Expensive but rare. The deep magenta pink flowers resemble slightly folded, ‘propellor blades’. Happy in sun part shade where it will scramble up through other plants/shrubs.
- Geranium* ‘Criss Canning’ D \$15.00
To 40 cms. Large, deepest blue flowers with red veining. Sun or light shade. Very popular.
- Geranium oxonianum* f. ‘Thurstonianum’ D \$12.00
To 50 cms. Pink-purple flowers. Sun or light shade. Attracts insects.
- Geranium oxonianum* ‘Heirloom Raspberry’ \$12.00
To 45 cms. Very stunning deep raspberry-coloured flowers with deeper veins with a white eye. Sun.

(Cranesbill). To 75 cms. Stunning with vibrant magenta pink flowers with deep maroon centres and veining. Very long flowering. Ground cover. Sun. Very popular.

Rare taller variety with beautiful double blue flowers. To about 80 cms in height. Sun or light shade, moist soil.

To 50 cms. Dark green, deeply divided leaves which take on autumn hues. Suits sun/part shade.

Purple Blue. Very popular. To 45 cms. Masses of purple blue flowers with darker veining. from late spring. Very long flowering. Deeply divided leaves. Sun or light shade. Lovely variety.

To 20 cms. Single, bright red/orange flowers with yellow stamens from spring. Ground cover – suits rockery, borders & over walls. Suits dry, rocky or sandy, well-drained soil in full sun. Trim after flowering for repeat flowering.

20 to 40 cms in height. Full sun. Suits rock garden. Bright yellow daisies in summer over several weeks. Attracts butterflies.

(Japanese Iris). To 90 cms. Stunning variety with large pale blue flowers with fine white edging. white flowers in summer. Sun. Average to moist soil. May need trimmed.

To 70 cms. Erect, clump-forming and rhizomatous with arching, grey-green leaves. The flower is yellow, closely veined purple and the general effect is brown.

Deep crimson red flowers in summer. Long flowering. Sun or light shade. Large pots.		
Lathyrus latifolius 'Red Pearl'	D	\$10.00
Rare perennial sweet pea. Heavy trusses of bright carmine red, fleshy, substantial flowers on long strong stems in summer. Climber. Sun or partial shade. Fertile humus rich, well-drained soil. Large.

Large white flowers in summer. Climber. Sun. 2.5 litre pots.

To 45 cms. Double magenta pink flowers from October. Sun. Very good drainage, suits poor soils.

To 90 cms. Long spikes of yellow flowers in summer. Clump forming ground cover. Sun.

To 1 metre. Huge, deep red, satiny flowers late spring/early summer. Sun.		
Papaver orientale 'Princess Victoria Louise'	D	\$12.00
Large salmon pink flowers late spring to early summer. Sun and good drainage. Popular.

- Penstemon 'Stapleford Gem' \$12.00
Seldom available and a stunning, popular variety. To 60 cms. Flowers from mid-summer with beautiful lilac-purple flowers which have pale lilac-pink upper lips and white lower lips and throats marked with purple lines. Sun/part shade.
- Phlox maculata 'Omega' D \$12.00
To 90 cms. Narrow leaves. Cylindrical panicles of fragrant white flowers, each with a reddish eye. Summer flowering. Sun or part shade. Suitable for cottage or wildlife garden, borders, cut flowers.
- Phyteuma scheuchzeri Few D \$12.00
Low mound of narrow blue-green leaves. Taller stems hold spiky ball-shaped clusters of deep blue flowers in summer. Rich moist soil and good drainage. Excellent rock garden or edging plant.
- Salvia nemerosa 'Blue Hills' D \$12.00
To about 45 cms. Lovely blue flowers in summer. Cut back after flowering and look forward to an autumn flowering. Sun and good drainage. Rockery, edging, slope or bank. Attracts butterflies.
- Salvia sclarea var. turkestanica 'Vatican Pink' \$15.00
The odd plant has white flowers. Short-lived perennials, however, it survives in my garden for a few years. Let it self-seed. 75 to 90 cms. Attractive large flowering spikes. Large white-pink bracts. Impressive and long flowering summer/autumn. Fragrant. Economic, culinary, medicinal and ornamental virtues. Sun and good drainage. Specimen plant.
- Salvia x jamensis 'Salmon Queen' \$12.00
To 80 cms. Fragrant leaves and showy flowers that are a very good salmon colour. Flowers late spring onwards. Long flowering. Sun and good drainage. Attracts bees and butterflies. Popular.
- Scabiosa caucasica 'Mt Cook' \$12.00
To 50 cms. Large white flowers which are suitable for cutting. Sun or light shade.
- Scabiosa caucasica x 'Fama Blue' \$12.00
To about 90 cms. Colours may be mid blue to purply/blue. Variable colours. Sun/light shade.

To 1.2 metres. Hooded purply blue flowers on very erect spikes early to mid-summer. Unusually early for Aconitum. Great for back of border – best staked. Part shade, moist. 1.5 litre.
- Aconitum ssp. vulgare 'Albidum' Collect D \$15.00
To 1.5 metres Upright with rounded, dark green leaves divided into five to seven, slender, toothed lobes and dense racemes of hooded, white flowers in summer. Suits sun or part shade. Impressive.

To 70 cms. Candelabra style primula. From mid spring, stout stems carry tiered whorls of flowers. The striking red/orange buds open to orangey yellow. Some shade best and moist soil.
- Roscoea alpina* 'Royle' D \$12.00
Pretty, pink and white, orchid-like flowers from early summer. Light shade and good drainage.
- Roscoea auriculata* D \$15.00
30 45 cms. Long, lance-shaped, grass green leaves. The brilliant purple flowers resemble orchids and display white to pale violet markings on each plant. Plant the tubers deeply in light shade on the edge of the woodland garden. Good
- Tricyrtis hirta* (Toad Lily). D \$9.00
Beautiful orchid-like flowers in autumn. White with purple spots. Moist soil. Great for shady woodland or perennial border. Well-drained, rich, moist soil. Coded as Number 8.
- Tricyrtis tojen* 'Taipei Silk' D \$10.00
Coded as number 5. To 90 cms. Late flowering. Lavender/purple/white flowers with purple spots. Yellow at base of petals and yellow/brownish red stamens/antlers. Some shade, moist soil.
- Uvularia grandiflora* (Bellwort) D 12.00
To 40 cms. Showy yellow flowers in spring. Part to full shade. Woodland areas or perennial border.

Perennials – Foliage

- Arisarum proboscideum* (Mouse Plant) Few D \$8.00
Deep green, glossy, arrowhead leaves. Long-tailed, brown and white flowers that suggest mice doing handstands in the greenery. Ground cover. Goes dormant in hot weather. Partial shade. 5 pieces \$20
- Aruncus dioicus* D \$12.00
(Goats Beard). To 1.5 metres. Many dramatic plumes composed of tiny, white flowers in autumn. Light shade and moist soil-needs moisture over summer. Ideal for light shade and by water.
- Astilbe arendsii* 'Fanal' D \$12.00
To 40 cms. Lovely deepest red flowers late spring/summer. Bronze/green foliage. Moist shade.
- Centaurea dealbata* D \$12.00
To about 60 cms. Dark pink flowers over divided foliage. Sun or part shade - tolerates drier conditions. Attracts bees and butterflies. 1.3 litre.
- Chiastophyllum oppositifolium* Few \$12.00
Alpine succulent. To 15 cms. Unusual dangling yellow flowers with fleshy leaves which change colour from mid-green to red. Containers, rockeries and rock wall. Dappled shade. Good drainage.
- Cimicifuga americana* Needs collected or Trimmed Back for Courier D \$15.00
To 1.2 metres. Spikes of fragrant white flowers summer/autumn. Excellent for cutting.
- Convallaria majalis* 'Albo striata' D \$15.00
Rare. Variegated lily of the valley, with cream-striped leaves and cream-white flowers. Only one piece with large shoot per pot. Arching bell-shaped flowers late spring. Highly fragrant. Good cut flower – slow growing. Shade/woodland. Most variegated cultivars revert to plain leaves within a few years, but 'Albo striata' is less likely to do so.
- Dicentra cucullaria* - Pink Few D \$12.00
Green fern-like foliage in spring. Pink flowers. Woodland ground cover.

- Disporopsis omeiensis* \$12.00
Resembles an evergreen Solomon's Seal with snakeskin patterns on the stem, pale greenish-yellow flowers. To 50 cms. Some shade best. 5 pieces - \$20.00
- Disporum sessile* 'Variegatum' D \$10.00
To 25 cms. Green and white striped variegated leaves. 25mm hanging creamy white bells. Forms a showy colony in shade. An excellent groundcover under shrubs.'

- Persicaria microcephala* 'Red Dragon' Trimmed D 5 pieces - \$20.00
To 90 cms. Beautiful foliage. Pointy heart-shaped leaves are medium green with a silvery V-shaped marking and a bronze centre. Tiny white flowers late summer. Part/full shade.

Podophyllum hexandrum/emodi D \$12.00
 30 - 50 cms. Trillium like, glossy green, mottled leaves are deeply lobed. Emerging leaves are umbrella - shaped. Light pink flowers are followed by bright red/orange fruit. Light sandy to medium soil with good drainage. Suits dappled shade, moist soil. Lovely foliage plant.

 Early flowering alpine. Irregular leaf edges- silvery margins. Purple flowers. Very good drainage.

Primula sieboldii are about 20 cms in height and summer dormant. Leaves are pale green, wrinkled and covered in short hairs. Pretty flowers, often fringed, in spring. Part shade. Light woodland.

30 cms. Pointed, bright lime-green leaves with dark red veins. Harvest young leaves for salads.

(Woodland sage). 35 cms. Mounding ground cover with unusual, ruffled leaves with a touch of white on the edges. Nice texture. Spikes of tiny charming lipped, cream to pale yellow-green flowers in summer. Shade. Tolerates dry conditions once established. 1 litre.

Thalictrum aquilegifolium 'Album' Collect or trimmed back D \$12.00

To 1m. Stems of very pretty foliage topped with fluffy pale lavender/white flowers from late spring. Sun, semi-shade.

Veratrum nigrum Few D \$15.00

Mature plants grow to about 1.2 metres. Superb variety and perhaps the finest of all Veratrums. Strong spikes bear dark purple, almost black, star-shaped flowers. Leathery green leaves are beautifully pleated. Long lived border plant. Part sun/part shade.
