20 very small bulbs. Seed was sown 2024 to 2025. Mature bulbs have flowering spikes to about 1 metre. Tall straight stems and racemes of star-shaped blue flowers – mixed blues. Racemes of flowers open from bottom to top. Late spring to early summer flowering. Impressive in flower.

Eucomis – white with pink tinge Large bulbs D \$6.00
Height to 45 cms+. Sun and good drainage. Late summer/autumn flowering. Potted.

Eucomis – white with pink tinge – 3 medium sized bulbs, most are in flower Few 3 for \$10.00

Muscari ‘Iceberg’ 5 large sized bulbs \$10.00
Have flowered. Lovely pale blue flowers in spring. Sun and good drainage.

Mixed - could be either the white/amethyst/violet variety or white. Mature plants have foliage to at least 55 cms. Divided ferny foliage. Choice woodland plant. Slender, elegant spikes bear nodding, opalescent flowers. Humus-rich, semi-shaded, moist but well drained soil.

Cimicifuga americana 20 for \$5.00
To 1.2 metres. Spikes of fragrant white flowers summer/autumn. Excellent for cutting. (2025)

Clanthus puniceus (Kakabeak) 30 for \$4.00
Native shrub with striking clusters of red flowers. To 2 metres. Flowers spring to early summer.2024.

Incarvillea delavayi 20 for \$4.00
To 35 cms. Masses of large pink, trumpet shaped flowers from late spring.

Incarvillea delavayi 20 for \$4.00
To 35 cms. Masses of large, pure white trumpet shaped flowers from late spring. Cut back after flowering so this will rebloom. Bold, divided leaves. Sun. Moist, well-drained soil. Nice for pots.

To 60 cms. Pretty upward-facing, short-spurred, bicoloured flowers. Blue with contrasting white on the upper parts of the sepals. Sun or light shade. Suits borders, rock gardens, cottage gardens, open shade gardens, woodland gardens or naturalized areas.

To 40 cms. Masses of light-yellow daisy-like flowers from October. Very long flowering. A trim back promotes more flowering. Sun.

Sun or light shade, Great for picking.

To 80 cms. Summer flowering. Popular. Sun or part shade. Suitable for cut flowers.

Foliage was darker than other plants – blackish green. Sun or light shade. Great for picking

Colours unknown but could be pink, pink/white/green or green/white. Sun and good drainage.

Clear mid pink. Nice variety – popular. Sun or light shade. New plants.

Campanula ‘Fleur de Neige’ D \$12.00
To 90 cms. Long spikes of double white flowers in summer. Sun to part shade.

- Campanula rotundifolia* D \$12.00
(Bluebells of Scotland). Height to 25 cms. Graceful, nodding, mauve-purple bells in early summer. Ideal for edging, containers and rock gardens. Sun. Long flowering.
- Campanula 'Van Houtei'* (Mystic Bells) D \$12.00
60 cms. Pretty, clump forming ground cover for sunny area. Constant abundance of large mid blue flowers from late spring to autumn. Trim after flowering for repeat flowerings. Large pots.
- Centaurea Jacea* Few \$10.00
To 40 cms. Low clumps of green leaves. Summer flowering with cornflower-like flowers in a bright rose-pink-purple colour. Attracts bees/butterflies. Ideal in wildflower gardens.
- Centaurea macrocephala* D \$15.00
Rare. To 1 metre. Large yellow, thistle-like flowers in mid-summer. Good cut/dried flower.. Sun and good drainage. Resents disturbance.
- Centaurea pulcherrima* D \$10.00
To 40 cms. Grey green feathered foliage with large pink flowers from late spring. Sun. 1.5 litre.
- Coreopsis verticillata* D \$10.00
To 40 cms. Bushy rhizomatous perennial with numerous branched stems. Bears yellow daisy like flowerheads in loose corymbs in early summer. Sun or part shade, well-drained soil. Large.
- Coreopsis verticillata 'Moonbeam'* Few D \$12.00
50 cms. Deep green foliage, soft yellow daisy-like flowers summer/autumn. Sun. Makes an ideal middle of border plant, cottage garden, rock garden, pots.
- Dianthus 'Knappii'* Few \$12.00
To 40 cms. Drought tolerant alpine. Long stems with clusters of light-yellow flowers in summer. Average/dry/sandy well-drained soil. Attracts insects.
- Dictamnus albus var. albiflorus* Few D \$12.00
(Burning Bush). Year 1 plants. May take 3 years to flower. Mature plants are 80 to 90 cms. Highly fragrant, white 5-petalled flowers with long, projecting stamens are borne in long, open racemes in early summer. Takes on a greenish white appearance. Specimen plant in garden and best planted where you can brush past them so you can enjoy the fragrance released.
- Dictamnus albus var. purpureus* D \$10.00
(Burning Bush). Year 1 plants. May take 3 years to flower. Mature plants are 80 to 90 cms. Highly fragrant, purpley - mauve, 5-petalled flowers with darker veins and long, projecting stamens are borne in long, open racemes in early summer. Specimen plant in garden.
- Dimorphotheca barbarae compacta* Few \$10.00
(African Daisy). Height to 30 cms. Compact, large flowering variety with pink flowers. Very long flowering ground cover. Sun. Large pots.
- Francoa appendiculata 'Pink Bouquet'* \$12.00
To about 90 cms when in flower in summer. Large pink flowers on long stems. Sun or light shade.
- Francoa appendiculata 'Lilac Bouquet'* Few \$12.00
To about 90 cms in flower. Large deep lilac pink flowers in summer. Sun or light shade.
- Geranium armenum 'Red Propellors'* D \$20.00
To 40 cms. Expensive but rare. The deep magenta pink flowers resemble slightly folded, 'propellor blades'. Happy in sun part shade where it will scramble up through other plants/shrubs.

- Geranium 'Criss Canning' D \$15.00
To 40 cms. Large, deepest blue flowers with red veining. Sun or light shade. Very popular.
- Geranium oxonianum f. 'Thurstonianum' D \$12.00
To 50 cms. Pink-purple flowers. Sun or light shade. Attracts insects. Trimmed back regularly.
- Geranium oxonianum 'Heirloom Raspberry' \$12.00
To 45 cms. Very stunning deep raspberry-coloured flowers with deeper veins with a white eye. Sun.
- Geranium oxonianum 'Hollywood' 5 pieces - \$20.00
To 75 cms. Largest growing form of G. oxonianum. Shiny green leaves with dark reddish markings. Small light pink flowers with magenta veins. Ground cover. Sun or shade. Trimmed back regularly.
- Geranium 'Spinners' D \$12.00
Purple Blue. Very popular. To 45 cms. Masses of purply blue flowers with darker veining. from late spring. Very long flowering. Deeply divided leaves. Sun or light shade. Lovely variety. Trimmed back regularly.
- Geranium x 'Johnson's Blue' Few D \$12.00
To 70 cms. Flowers will vary in colour as they are from a hybrid - shades of blue from spring to autumn, very long flowering. Cut back in early summer for repeat blooming. Drought tolerant, full sun. Dry to average soil, good drainage. Great for cottage gardens, containers, borders or mass plantings.
- Geum rivale 'Jess' \$12.00
To 25 cms. Frilly peach apricot semi-double flowers in spring. Sun or part shade. 5 pieces - \$20
- Geum rivale 'Roseum' 5 pieces \$20.00
Dwarf variety with small salmon-pink hooded flowers. Very cute! Sun or part shade and well-drained soil. Suits a rockery type situation. Flowers in spring and again spasmodically summer to late autumn.
- Geum rivale \$12.00
Beautiful dwarf variety with pretty lemon flowers with a pink flush, in spring. Sun or light shade.
- Geum rivale Venomous Red \$12.00
Dwarf variety with deep salmon pink flowers. Sun and good drainage. 5 pieces - \$20
- Helianthemum 'Henfield Brilliant' \$12.00
To 20 cms. Single, bright red/orange flowers with yellow stamens from spring. Ground cover – suits rockery, borders & over walls. Suits dry, rocky or sandy, well-drained soil in full sun. Trim after flowering for repeat flowering.
- Inula ensifolia Few D \$10.00
20 to 40 cms in height. Full sun. Suits rock garden. Bright yellow daisies in summer over several weeks. Attracts butterflies.
- Iris ensata 'Sea Fury' D \$12.00
(Japanese Iris). To 90 cms. Stunning variety with large pale blue flowers with fine white edging. white flowers in summer. Sun. Average to moist soil.

- Iris 'Holden Clough' \$5.00 per large piece
To 70 cms. Erect, clump-forming and rhizomatous with arching, grey-green leaves. The flower is yellow, closely veined purple and the general effect is brown. Sent barerooted.
- Knautia 'Egyptian Rose' D \$12.00
Deep crimson red flowers in summer. Long flowering. Sun or light shade 9 cm to 1.5 litre pots.
- Kniphofia 'Timothy' D \$12.00
To 1 metre. Very pretty peachy coloured flowers. Suitable for a dry and sunny position. Long flowering. Suits sandy soils.
- Lathyrus latifolius 'Red Pearl' D \$10.00
Rare perennial sweet pea. Heavy trusses of bright carmine red, fleshy, substantial flowers on long strong stems in summer. Climber. Sun or partial shade. Fertile humus rich, well-drained soil. Large.
- Papaver orientale 'Princess Victoria Louise' D \$12.00
Large salmon pink flowers in spring and light autumn flowering. Sun and good drainage.
- Papaver orientale 'Patty's Plum' Few D \$13.00
70 cms. Rich plum coloured Poppy – unusual colours. Sun. Popular variety.
- Phlox maculata 'Omega' D \$12.00
To 90 cms. Narrow leaves. Cylindrical panicles of fragrant white flowers, each with a reddish eye. Summer flowering. Sun or part shade. Suitable for cottage or wildlife garden, borders, cut flowers. Beautiful variety.
- Salvia sclarea var. turkestanica 'Vatican Pink' \$12.00
The odd plant has white flowers. Short-lived perennials, however, it survives in my garden for a few years. Let it self-seed. 75 to 90 cms. Attractive large flowering spikes. Large white-pink bracts. Impressive and long flowering summer/autumn. Fragrant. Economic, culinary, medicinal and ornamental virtues. Sun and good drainage. Specimen plant.
- Salvia x jamensis 'Nachtvlinder' \$12.00
To 60 cms. Lovely with 2 tone purple flowers that are highly fragrant. Long flowering. Suitable for sun. Dead-heading promotes more growth and flowering. Popular.
- Salvia x jamensis 'Salmon Queen' (Trimmed back as needed) \$12.00
To 80 cms. Fragrant leaves and showy flowers that are a very good salmon colour. Flowers late spring onwards. Long flowering. Sun and good drainage. Attracts bees and butterflies. Popular.
- Sanguisorba tenuifolia 'Rubra' D \$12.00
To 80 cms. Long arching stems of slender bottlebrush like flowers in summer, that are a lovely rosy red colour. Sun. Clump forming habit. Very popular each year.
- Scabiosa caucasica 'Blue Mountain' Few \$12.00
To about 80 cms. Large mid blue flowers from spring.
- Tanacetum coccineum 'Robinson's Pink' D \$12.00
(Painted Daisy). To 90 cms. Pretty pink, single daisy flowers late spring/summer. Finely-cut, ferny like foliage. Sun/semi-shade. Cottage garden, mixed border, cut flowers last well. Popular. Large pots.

Perennials - Shade

- Aconitum napellus* D \$12.00
To 1.5 metres. Hooded purply blue flowers late summer/autumn. Part/full shade. Moist. 1 litre.
- Anemone multifida* 'Rubra' Few D \$12.00
To 30 cms. A lovely long display of single, deep rose, carmine red, long stemmed flowers with a pale yellow centre. Green ferny-like leaves. Attractive fluffy seedheads. Sun and good drainage. Suits rock garden, mixed border or edge of woodland. Drought tolerant. Attracts butterflies.
- Anemone nemerosa bracteata pleniflora* D \$10.00
Woodland Anemone. Height to 10 cms. Double white flowers with a green ruff in spring. Some shade best. Borders, rock gardens, tubs and around the base of trees. 5 pieces - \$20
- Anemone nemorosa* mixed D \$10.00
May include blue shades, lemon or yellow.
- Anemone ranunculoides sulphurea* 'Flore Plena' D \$10.00
Woodland Anemone. Yellow flowers in spring. Part to full shade. Ground cover. 5 pieces - \$20
- Anemone siemania* D \$10.00
Woodland Anemone – pretty lemon flowers in spring. 5 pieces - \$20
- Campanula glomerata* 'Superba' D \$12.00
To 30 cms. Large upright purple bells from late spring. Trim back after flowering.
- Dicentra spectabilis* 'Valentine' D \$25.00
30 to 50 cms in height. Deep salmon pink flowers with a white tip in spring. Large, puffy heart-shaped flowers dangle from the leafless stems. Emerging foliage has a tinge of purple. Part shade and good drainage. (Commonly called the 'Red' variety).
- Ourisia coccinea* D \$12.00
Rare sell-out variety. Height to 30 cms. Stunning. Large, long, tubular red flowers in summer. Shade. Consistent moisture but well-drained soil.
- Pachyphragma macrophylla* \$15.00
Beautiful, long-flowering, clump forming ground cover. To 40cm high with rounded, scalloped green basal leaves up to 10cm across in rosettes and smaller stem leaves. Flat clusters of small white flowers winter to spring, followed by small green fruits which are shaped like upside-down hearts. Brightens up garden.
- Primula Avondale* – Pink D \$12.00
(Irish Primrose). Lovely pink flowers, very pretty. Light shade ideal. Good drainage.
- Roscoea alpina* 'Royle' D \$12.00
Pretty, pink and white, orchid-like flowers from early summer. Light shade and good drainage.
- Roscoea auriculata* D \$15.00
30 45 cms. Long, lance-shaped, grass green leaves. The brilliant purple flowers resemble orchids and display white to pale violet markings on each plant. Plant the tubers deeply in light shade on the edge of the woodland garden. Summer flowering – stunning variety.
- Tricyrtis hirta* (Toad Lily). D \$9.00
Beautiful orchid-like flowers in autumn. White with purple spots. Moist soil. Great for shady woodland or perennial border. Well-drained, rich, moist soil. Coded as Number 8.

Tricyrtis hirta 'Tojen' D \$12.00
 Coded as number 1. To 75 cms. Large orchid-like and luminous, lavender flowers with yellow-throated bases summer/early autumn. Early flowering. Exotic looking for woodland borders and shade. Moist but well-drained soil in part/full shade.

Tricyrtis tojen 'Taipei Silk' D \$10.00
 Coded as number 5. To 90 cms. Late flowering. Lavender/purple/white flowers with purple spots. Yellow at base of petals and yellow/brownish red stamens/antlers. Some shade, moist soil.

Uvularia grandiflora (Bellwort) Few D 12.00
 To 40 cms. Showy yellow flowers in spring. Part to full shade. Woodland areas or perennial border.

Perennials – Foliage

Arisarum proboscideum (Mouse Plant) Few D \$8.00
 Deep green, glossy, arrowhead leaves. Long-tailed, brown and white flowers that suggest mice doing handstands in the greenery. Ground cover. Goes dormant in hot weather. Partial shade. 5 pieces \$20

Aruncus dioicus (Goats Beard). To 1.5 metres. Many dramatic plumes composed of tiny, white flowers in autumn. Light shade and moist soil-needs moisture over summer. Ideal for light shade and by water. Trimmed D \$12.00

Astilbe arendsii 'Fanal' D \$12.00 To 40 cms. Lovely deepest red flowers late spring/summer. Bronze/green foliage. Moist shade.

Astilbe Chinensis Few D \$12.00
 To 40 cms. Dwarf variety-deep purplish pink flowers from late summer. Moist soil, shade.

Centaurea dealbata D \$12.00
 To about 60 cms. Dark pink flowers over divided foliage. Sun or part shade - tolerates drier conditions. Attracts bees and butterflies.

Cimicifuga americana Trimmed D \$15.00
 To 1.2 metres. Spikes of fragrant white flowers summer/autumn. Excellent for cutting.

Dicentra cucullaria - Pink Few D \$12.00
 Green fern-like foliage in spring. Pink flowers. Woodland ground cover.

Disporopsis omeiensis Few \$12.00
 Resembles an evergreen Solomon's Seal with snakeskin patterns on the stem, pale greenish-yellow flowers. To 50 cms. Some shade best. 5 pieces - \$20.00

Disporopsis pernyi D \$14.00
 To 45 cms. Upright-arching, purple-spotted stems with shiny, leather leaves. Evergreen. Pendulous, tubular, creamy-white, bell-shaped flowers from late spring. Purple-blue berries ripen in early autumn. Rhizomatous, clump forming ground cover. Moist, well-drained soil for part shade.

Disporum sessile 'Variegatum' D \$10.00
 To 25 cms. Green and white striped variegated leaves. 25mm hanging creamy white bells. Forms a showy colony in shade. An excellent groundcover under shrubs.'

Epimedium pauciflorum Few \$15.00
 To 20 cms. Rare variety, seldom available. Copper tinted serrated foliage. Dainty pale pink flowers. Suits dry shady areas.

In midsummer, the upright flower spikes are made up of white or pink florets. These add drama and definition to gardens in full sun and partial shade. Suits by water, woodland, or in other moist garden sites. Humous rich soil, partial shade to full sun.

Rodgersia podophylla D \$15.00
1 metre. Great architectural plant for moist, humus rich soil and some shade. Striking bronze coloured leaves in spring, going dark green through summer, then turning red in autumn. Masses of tiny creamy white flowers, sometimes flushed pink or red.

Rumex sanguineus \$9.00 or 5 for \$40
To 30 cms. Pointed, bright lime-green leaves with dark red veins. Harvest young leaves for salads. Sun/light shade and moist soil.

Teucrium scorodonia Crispum Marginatum D \$13.00
(Woodland sage). 35 cms. Mounding ground cover with unusual, ruffled leaves with a touch of white on the edges. Nice texture. Spikes of tiny charming lipped, cream to pale yellow-green flowers in summer. Shade. Tolerates dry conditions once established. 1.5 litre.

Thalictrum delavayi D \$12.00
To 1.2 metres. Beautiful for summer flowering. Purple tinted stems and ferny like foliage. Clusters of large, fluffy-looking flowers with lilac petals and pale yellow stamens. Sun to part shade ideal. Mature plants grow to 1.5 metres. Suits cottage, or woodland garden or perennial border.
